EQX Affiliation Update: WYH and EQX Sign Affiliation Paperwork


At last, we have liftoff!!!

The Affiliation Agreement (AA) and Administrative Services Agreement (ASA) have been approved by the Whitney Young Health (WYH) and Equinox (EQX) Boards. So what does that mean?

The specific responsibilities vary, but some of our WYH directors will supervise selected functions at EQX starting in mid-March. This includes, but is not limited to: Program Areas (ex., EQX Counseling Center & Health Home); IT; Facilities; and eventually Human Resources and Finance. On the next page is an illustration/chart that lays out the current structure of EQX departments and programs, (this structure will change as things develop.)

What are the next steps?

There are many parallel tracks moving behind the scenes. We are in discussion with State regulators to finalize our applications for licensure requirements.

- The WYH IT team is in the process of evaluating and ordering equipment and software to upgrade the IT infrastructure at EQX.
- **10e11,** the newly-minted electronic health record (EHR) system used at Dewitt Street for our Addiction Treatment Services program, is in the pre-implementation stage for Equinox.
- Our Operations Department is finalizing the priority list for improving of EQX facilities.

These projects are illustrative of only a portion of the work going on now and in the near future.

What happens when WYH starts managing the EQX services?

We don't anticipate many disruptions or noticeable changes for most WYH team members. If you haven't had a dialogue with your supervisor about your role with EQX programs, then most likely this affiliation will not be affecting your daily routine in the coming months.

As the affiliation process continues to develop over the next six months, things are subject to change, and we will continue to keep you up to date.



Children's Dental Health Month

February is **National Children's Dental Health Month** (**NCDHM**), and this year Whitney Young Health celebrated and observed this event through a number of initiatives and programs.

The the 2023 theme for NCDHM, spearheaded by the American Dental Association (ADA), was "Brush, Floss, Smile". The ADA provided flyers and posters on this theme, in English and Spanish, which were distributed to all health center locations.





On Friday, February 10, Spectrum News taped a news segment at WYH Dental about NCDHM and preventative dental care for children in general. *Click the image to the left to view the news segment.*

During the week of February 20-24, **Whitney on Wheels (WOW)** and **Seal a Smile** collaborated on providing dental appointments at **Marillac Family Shelter** (a program of St. Catherine's Center for Children) and at the **Swinburne Health Center**.

Seal a Smile (SAS), a joint venture of **Healthy Capital District (HCD)** and Whitney Young Health, was established to provide preventative dental care to elementary school-aged children in local schools where over 35% of the children are eligible for the federal free lunch program. SAS provides preventive dental services such as screenings, cleanings, fluoride, and sealants, delivered with the medical and administrative oversight of WYH at schools, and also at Head Start and other child-centered programs.




