Building & Facilities Updates

Whitney Young Health has quite a few exciting updates from our Facilities Director **Scott Bryson** this month:

10 Dewitt – We are trying to get on the final approvals from the city and working towards the final design. If the stars align correctly we could be targeting July as a start date

920 Lark – June 20th is still the goal but there are a few more hurdles to jump and things have to fall our way. We are zeroing in on sending out bid documents and starting to put the project together as far as construction.

With our new affiliation with Equinox (EQX), we have engaged and selected Bonoquisti Construction in the rehab project of **500 Central**, an EQX office. We are still waiting for a couple of final details and then we launch into scoping and pricing the work.

Worx Hub – Facilities is getting very close to launching a **new work order system** that will help us track work orders and completions, plus this is the first step to the Facilities department becoming deficiency-free as this system is very in tune with Joint Commission standards.

3Xlogic – We are getting ready to roll out a full keyless system at 900.

Things are moving along as WYH settles into the everyday routine of managing Equinox (EQX) facilities.

Scott Bryson, Director of Facilities, recently went to the Holt House, one of EQX's four NYS Office of Mental Health (NYSOMH) certified residential facilities, to fix a leaky pipe, so this issue of Whitney Wire seems like an excellent opportunity to provide a broad overview of the services offered at all four residential facilities.

Equinox operates four NYSOMHcertified residential programs, all in Albany County. Each program is designed to best serve clients with different sets of needs. Staffed around the clock, the residences provide medication supervision and offer clients a safe place to live while working on rehabilitation goals, training in self-advocacy, and preparing to re-enter the community to live healthy, productive lives.

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All Whitney Young Health locations will be CLOSED on Monday, May 29 in observance of Memorial Day

Apartment Program

Accommodates 36 adults living in one or two-bedroom apartments. 18 of the residents can live in individual apartments with staff available on site 24/7. The Program provides regular case management support for individuals who are ready for less structure and more independence. The program's goal is to help residents acquire the skills needed for independent living in the community.

Cohoes Residence

Serves 14 adults. Each resident has their own bedroom and shares a large living room, dining room, and family room with other residents. Staff are available to help with day-to-day issues and to teach a wide variety of living skills. The Cohoes Residence offers recreational activities at the house and in the community, encouraging residents to lead full, active lives. Many activities involving residents' families are scheduled throughout the year.

Holt House

Is a specialized program that serves 11 adults with both mental illness and developmental disabilities. A structured daily schedule and intensive staffing give residents the support necessary to live more independently. Staff encourage residents to take ownership and pride in Holt House by having them plan special activities and assist in evaluating house rules.

Recovery Residence

Serves 12 adults who have both a mental illness and an addiction. The program helps residents build the skills necessary to live successfully in the community. Required programming includes attending Alcoholics Anonymous or Narcotics Anonymous meetings, which encourage residents to develop a community support network, as well as other groups designed to support sober, clean living.


